THE PETROLEUM POLICY ROUNDTABLE BEFORE THE FINAL CURTAIN: STRATEGIC RESPONSES OF OIL EXPORTERS IN AFRICA TO THE 2050 ZERO CARBON EMISSIONS TARGET

The energy transition, which refers to the switching away or transformation of the global energy sector from fossil-fuel dominated energy supply mix to net zero-carbon emission sources, has fundamental implications for all petroleum exporters, particularly those that remain dependent on its revenues. Whilst recognizing the inevitability of increased damage to the environment if nothing is done to mitigate global warming, there is the need for strategic thinking as to the appropriate paths for such economies, particularly those that remain beset with problem of underdevelopment, global poverty and millions of people that still rely on subsistence fuels. Strategies to realise this objective by ensuring growth that aligns with sustainable development, and with the use of the abundant energy resources in Africa is now an imperative. Given this context, the key aim of this session is to analyse what the energy transition means for the development of Africa's vast oil and gas resources.
